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Title: A Sociological Study of Indian Classical Dance: The Case of

Bharatanatyam

ABSTRACT

This research is a study of contemporary choreographies in the Indian classical dance

form of Bharatanatyam, with ethnographic descriptions of works developed by

dancer/ choreographer Geeta Chandran and her institution, Natya Vriksha based in

New Delhi. Understanding performance as constitutive of culture, this study outlines

the social framework of these dance works with the help of the core concepts of ritual

and theatre, secularisation and democratisation, constraints and creativity and text and

action.

This research has attempted to develop a methodology to understand the process of

the making of a performance and to analyse the various socio-cultural influences that

contribute in the shaping of not only the performance, but also the course the making

of it takes

The choreographic works included in this research are collaborations between

classical Bharatanatyam and other genres of performing arts like puppetry, martial

arts, modern dance and theatre. These have created new vocabularies to address

themes, which according to the artist are relevant in contemporary society. The

journey of Bharatanatyam has witnessed a series of conceptual shifts in its practice

and perception and an analysis of these shifts demonstrates the ways in which a performing art makes itself available to its practitioners, responding to the changing aesthetic and cognitive needs of a society.
