



Vigilance Awareness Week-2022

'Corruption Free India for a Developed Nation' (October 31, 2022 - November 6, 2022)

The play highlighted that corruption is way beyond and could take place anywhere in any form. It also encouraged the audience to discourse the silence on corruption in the country. The play was indeed engaging and was well received with a huge gathering of audience of varied stature. It triggered the emotions of the audience and seemed to connect deeply as the play garnered lots of applause and cheers from everyone.
