Applications are invited from eligible candidates for one post of Research Associate for a project funded by the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi titled "Borderland migration, neo-liberal India and borderland identity."

Project description: Scholars belonging to different disciplines have analyzed historical and contemporary migration into, out of and within India. Migration from the country has been a focus for many decades, and the remittances sent by the migrants have been highly appreciated. In addition, migration towards North East India has also been studied extensively. However, no comprehensive study has been made on the issue of outward migration from North East India to other parts of the country. But, it is gradually gaining public importance, political significance and social relevance in recent days.

Position: Research Associate (one post)

Project Duration: 24 months

Essential Qualification: Masters degree in social science with at least 55 per cent marks/an equivalent grade.

Desirable Qualification: (i) knowledge of field research and (ii) familiarity with issues concerning North East India.

Fellowship: Rs 16,000 per month (consolidated).
