2.3.2 – Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

The idea of starting a scheme of coaching classes for Minorities was conveyed by the University Grants Commission in pursuance of the Government policy of bringing educationally backward minorities on par with the rest of the society and to make them participate fully in the activities of national development. Accordingly, in 1984, the University Grants Commission formulated a scheme regarding coaching classes for competitive examinations for students belonging to weaker sections among educationally backward minority communities. In order to meet the objectives as defined above and in pursuance of its mandate, the Centre for Coaching and Career Planning runs free coaching programmes for aspirants belonging to SC, ST, Women and Minority communities who wish to prepare themselves and compete for a variety of jobs, both academic and

administrative, as also to pursue courses of studies in the areas of their choice. The funding for the Centre is available from the University Grants Commission and Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India. The Centre draws upon qualified faculty with professional orientation to meet the requirements of the coaching programmes. Students are selected for coaching on the basis of an entrance test conducted for the purpose, and they are offered classroom teaching, which is supplemented and strengthened by periodic tests and evaluation. The library of the Centre has a holding of relevant material on a variety of subjects which is replenished regularly to facilitate students access to current and relevant material available in the required areas. The principal objectives of the scheme are To provide coaching facilities, testing and evaluation to enable the aspirants to succeed in various competitive examinations for recruitment to services under the central and state governments, public and private undertakings etc. To provide coaching facilities for admission to a variety of professional courses. To provide coaching in communication skill and personality development. To provide study material and library facilities

7.2 – Best Practices

7.2.1 – Describe at least two institutional best practices

Practical: Biowaste management The Context As per the act passed by the Ministry of Environment and Forests in 1986 notified the Bio Medical Waste (Management and Handling) Rules in July 1998, it is the duty of every "occupier", i.e. a person who has the control over the institution or its premises, to take all steps to ensure that waste generated is handled without

any adverse effect to human health and environment. The competent authority therefore decided to implement for strict compliance of such policy across the departments and faculties where biowastes are generated. Objectives of the Practice

- No occupier shall establish onsite treatment and disposal facility.

- Operator of a common biomedical waste treatment and disposal facility to ensure the timely collection of biomedical waste from the user department/Centre.
- to classify and segregate Biomedical waste at source. The

Practice Biomedical Waste is any kind of waste containing infectious (or potentially infectious) materials. It may also include waste associated with the generation of biomedical waste that visually appears to be of medical or laboratory origin (e.g., packaging, unused bandages, infusion kits, etc.), as well research laboratory waste containing biomolecules or organisms that are mainly restricted from environmental release. In JMI, substantial research is being carried out in the areas of Life Sciences, Oncology, Oral diseases other than the routine patients in Faculty of Dentistry and Ansari Clinic. With Institutional Ethical and Biosafety committee in place, it is necessary to dispose generated biowaste through proper protocol and procedures. Since biomedical waste is distinct from normal trash or general waste, and differs from other types of hazardous waste, such as chemical, radioactive, universal or industrial waste, a dedicated segregation, handling and disposal is needed.

Evidence of Success With research theme clearance of IEC and BS committee, faculty members are able to secure research grants from several funding agencies such as DBT, DST, ICMR, AYUSH, DHR as the committees make sure that the biowaste are properly handled. Several students have been benefitted by getting prestigious SRF/RA fellowships from these agencies. Challenges

Encountered and Resources Required The competent authority has provided supportive role in signing MoU with agencies that handle biowaste and made it easier for faculty members to carry out research in related areas. The challenge of segregation has also been sorted out by providing differently coloured bins with poly bags which are then securely stored at a common place for collection by the assigned agency. Practice2: Harvesting energy from renewable energy sources (roof top solar panels) The Context Rooftop solar offers certain advantages over large solar plants as no land and additional transmission capacity is required. In addition, it saves transmission and distribution losses, which are to the tune of 30 percent.
