Jamia Millia Islamia came into existence through the tireless efforts of its founders -- Shaikh ul Hind Maulana Mahmud Hasan, Maulana Muhammad Ali Jauhar, Hakim Ajmal Khan, Dr. Mukhtar Ahmad Ansari, Janab Abdul Majeed Khwaja, and Dr. Zakir Husain. 

COURSE STRUCTURE :

The Course Structure of M.A. in Social Work is a four semester (two year) Post-Graduate Program with a generic base. The program is open to graduates of all academic disciplines and is designed to meet the expanding human resource requirements in the field of Welfare and Development. The Program lays a foundation in Social and Behavioural Science and Social Work Methods in the first two semesters. Advanced knowledge and exposure to Welfare or Development perspective (as per the chosen stream by the students) is provided in the final year. Students who opt for Social Welfare as their stream in the third and fourth semester are provided with specialised inputs for working at the micro and meso level. Skill labs are also aimed at strengthening their competencies for direct intervention with the client system.

The students opting for Social Development are trained to analyse macro social realities and understand its implications for human deprivation. They are assisted in developing a critical awareness of the social dimensions of economy and policy. The students acquire the ability for making interventions at the macro and meso level through policy research, advocacy, training and documentation. Field work opportunities to students are provided in organisations working on issues of education, health, environment, gender, homelessness, informal economy, children, marginalised groups, governance etc.

COURSE TRANSACTIONS :

Orientation:

The department of Social Work, Jamia Millia Islamia organises a ten days orientation program for the students of MA Social Work Semester-1 in the beginning of the semester. This orientation program ensures that the students of Social Work are acquainted with and experience first-hand the road to a professional Social Work career. During the transaction of this program, the students get a hands-on experience about the life of a professional Social Worker who works on field through field visits and public interactions organised on a daily basis, Furthermore, extension lectures, field visits, simulation games, skill labs and interactive sessions provide a lot of valuable input, and skills pertinent to the field of social work, along with introducing them to various fields

and dimensions of the profession Field visits to slums and resettlement colonies of Delhi orient the students to the working environment they would be placed in during field work and provide them with the required exposure.

Throughout this event, the students get acquainted with the teaching pedagogy, field work rules, the course, department, and the administrative framework. The extension lectures taken by specialised resource persons provided the students with a wholesome perspective about the theory and practice. This program ensures that all students are provided with an appropriate direction to professional learning.

Field Work:

Field Work training plays a pivotal role in the professional development of Social Work Students. It provides an opportunity for students to apply theoretical knowledge, skills and values within an organisational and community context. Most importantly, concurrent field work creates a holistic understanding of social problems and their causative factors while providing the opportunity to brainstorm and develop strategies for intervention. As field work is a year-long journey and involves rigorous training, students are placed with a variety of Governmental and Non- Governmental Organisations.

A faculty supervisor is provided to every student who guides them in achieving the set objectives of the field work. For each semester, objectives are carefully designed so that maximum emphasis is given on relating theory with practice. From understanding the community dynamics, to coming up with intervention strategies and applying different tools and techniques are taught, each student gains hands on experience.

Skill Lab:

Skill lab sessions are a core part of the course objectives. These are either facilitated by faculty members or external resource persons. With the help of these sessions the students are trained and developed in many soft skills, and at the same time, their personality is shaped as per the values and principles of the profession. In the first semester, focus is placed on communication, questioning skills and self-development. In the second semester, students are trained in research to prepare a research proposal and designing tools and survey.

In the third semester, students are trained in using computer applications for data tabulation, analysis, presentations along with project formulation, execution and reporting. The themes of skill labs include, but are not limited to PLA tools; therapeutic interventions in the context of groups; life skills; programming, interviewing skills in case work; advocacy; family therapy; budgeting; evaluation; and so on. The faculty supervisors support the application of these skills in the field work.

Rural Camp:

Rural Immersion is one of the scholastic components of the course. It aims at complementing the urban setting training by providing exposure to rural realities to produce professionals who are trained to work in diverse settings. The camp is rigorous in nature and consists of field visits, workshops, drills, guest lectures, etc. to train students in practical application of various social work tools.

Students are acquainted with functioning of various kinds of rural institutions. This hands-on experience allows trainees to understand and develop social skills and competence to work in rural settings. The Rural Immersion program in 2019 was organised by Department of Social Work in collaboration with Gandhi Smarak Ashram, Pattikalyana, in the Panipat district of Haryana.





VALUE ADDITIONS :

Individual Conference

Individual Conferences (IC), a critical tool of supervision, is arranged to facilitate interaction and feedback between the supervisor and supervisee in a systematic and confidential setting, ICs are held every week during an assigned time. They provide a platform to discuss the issues and concerns arising out of field work. The supervisor facilitates the process to help students relate theory with practice, and monitors their progress in terms of accomplishment of field work objectives. It provides the student an opportunity to reflect on their strengths and areas of improvement.

Group Conference

Group Conference is a vital part of the field work training as it enables the students to develop some of the basic skills to become an effective social work professional. Group Conferences are held twice in the whole course duration; one during semester II, and the other during semester III. It provides the students the opportunity to get exposure to a wide range of areas. Each student is supposed to assume the role of a Chairperson, Paper Presenter and Rapporteur, at least once in each Group Conference. It provides the students with an opportunity to experience the process of presentation of a formal academic and practice oriented paper, to chair and moderate a formal discussion in a systematic, precise manner. While the reporter acquires recording skills.

Computer Classes

Technical knowledge of computer programs like MS Excel and Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS) is imparted to the students through computer classes. This helps enhance their computer competency and IT skills. This directly contributes in the process of learning the use of computer data in their dissertations.

WORKSHOPS :

Three Days Life Skills Workshop:

The life skills workshop was facilitated by Prof. Murli Desai (visiting professor) and was an insightful and perceptive building for professional social work aspirants. Various themes were covered each day, such as a session on self-esteem, coping with violence, promoting communal harmony, and catharsis in the field of social work. Through the workshop, a lot of value addition happened and important skills were learned by the batch.

‘Cultural Rights and Rights to Inter-Cultural Inclusion’ was one of the important topics covered during the workshop wherein various concepts and theories were pondered upon. Furthermore, through multiple activities and demonstrations by the students themselves, such as presentations and role plays, these theories and concepts became apparent. Culture, ethnicity, identity, and their intersection were some of the important topics that were covered especially in the Indian context, along with cultural diversity, cultural conflicts, ethnocentrism, racism, casteism, multiculturalism, intercultural and minority cultural rights especially enshrined in the Indian constitution, etc.

Medical Social Work Workshop:

The purpose of the medical social work workshop that was facilitated by Ms. Monica Mehra who had experience worth of decades in the field was to apprise the students with the role of a Social Worker in healthcare settings in the current scenario and clearing varied uncertainties that were put forward by the students themselves.

The changing role of social work professionals in a health care system in the current scenario was examined at length. Other topics discussed were the dire need to challenge the stereotyping of social workers in the society, as well as questioning the prejudice of the corporates, and how it is important for social workers to establish their own roles and spaces in the Indian society.

It was understood that there is currently a necessity of holding key administrative positions in healthcare settings as social workers which would henceforth provide a necessary sensitive perception that these settings require immensely. The role of a social worker in a healthcare setting is vast and is right on the forefront in any given situation to help the people that require it in an empathetic manner. The session was full of professional tips and about the actual scenario and the latest happenings of the medical social work profession.

LGBTQ+ Workshop:

A workshop on 'Human Rights of Transgenders' was held as a part of the continuous and in-depth learning at the Department. Us students of social work, understand and realise the dire need there is for the voices and needs of every single community at the margins to be heard and put forward. This workshop was organised in collaboration with Society for Peoples' Awareness, Care and Empowerment (SPACE).

The purpose of the workshop was to make the students aware of the various concepts and theories associated with the topic at hand. Apart from this, first-hand experiences from people who belonged to the community were shared by them shedding light on what the current social norms are and how through it all, certain inequalities and discriminatory practices are reinforced, and how they lead to a very tough struggle in their lives. Knowing the perspectives of the LGBTQ+ community, their life struggles, the tussle that goes on inside their head, and the treatment they go through in and by the society by listening to their experiences first hand, cleared up misconceptions and shed immense perspective to the students.

Workshop On Marginalisation:

A professional workshop was organised by the Department of Social Work, JMI on the topic 'Minorities and Marginality' with Dr. Hem Borker as the resource person. Marginalisation as a process was discussed, where intersectionality of various aspects of a person's identity that play a major role to sideline them from the mainstream society was experienced with greater details. Through multiple activities and discussions, the intricacies of these processes were pondered upon.

Economic marginalisation, employment and livelihood marginalisation, educational marginalisation, gender disparity, etc. were some of the concepts upon which the students obtained clarity. Through this workshop, the students became more sensitive toward the marginalised communities.

GAIL Debating Competition (Vigilance Awareness Week) :

As a part of the Vigilance Awareness Week that has been observed annually since its initiation by the Department, the GAIL Elocution Competition was organised by in conjunction with Gas Authority India Limited (GAIL) on the topic: 'Integrity- as a Way of Life' which was also the theme for the year. The competition had two language categories: English and Hindi. Through this platform, apart from the students who had participated in the competition, other talents like shayari, ghazals, mimicry, music, and poetry came to the forefront through the in-house audience.

The competition brought out a diversity of ideas regarding the topic. This event enhanced the knowledge as well as various skills of the participants and the non-participants, along with their confidence, and provided them with exposure. The purpose of the occasion was fulfilled by providing a platform to the students for an extra-curricular activity, while also imparting knowledge to the students about various philosophical positions related to the topic and vigilance week.

Hope Project Field Visit:

Gaining field experience plays a vital role in the professional development of the Social Work trainees. Visiting the Hope Project as a part of orientation was the first experience for the students. The Hope Project is a non-profit organisation based in Basti Nizamuddin. The social work students' visit to the place was filled with insights and curiosity about professional social work. The tour of the agency and the neighbouring slum areas filled the students with hope of making a difference in the lives of people in need.

The students were given a full agency visit where they could see the programs running in the organisation, which included the Self help groups, Non-formal education, and crèche, amongst others, following which the students had a discussion with the Organisation Head about work that the organisation is doing in the neighbouring areas. This platform helped the beginners to get familiarised with the working of non government organisations, as well as the communities they would be working in.





COVID-19 RESPONSE :

- **Mental Health and Counselling Committee (MHCC) :** The sudden lockdown, quarantine, and social distancing, along with the pressures of academic life in a completely changed surrounding pushed the students to extreme levels of mental health issues. Recognising this problem, the university constituted the MHCC, headed by Professor S.M. Sajid from the department, to help students cope with distresses.
- **Faculty Training:** Online education required the teaching staff to be fully equipped with the knowledge of using technology to teach a class. The university took a pre-test to gauge the level of understanding of usage of internet and other tools required for online classes, and provided training sessions for the gaps identified in the skill set needed.
- **Webinars:** Several webinars were conducted by the Dept of Social Work, JMI to help students get an on-ground understanding of the practices and situation of field post Covid-19. These webinars included conversation around effect of Covid-19 on prevalence of domestic violence, children in childcare institutions, trend in the human resource industry and a consultative webinar on draft of National Council of Social Work (Education and Practice) Bill, 2020. The Department of Social Work (UGC Centre of Advanced Study), Jamia Millia Islamia ensured minimal impact of the global pandemic on the scope of learning for a student. The department organized the following webinars for continuous and in-depth learning of its students.
- The Department organized a National Webinar on **“Domestic Violence During Covid-19 Pandemic and Solution-Based Interventions”** on 25th July 2020. Dr. Sanghamitra Dhar (Consultant, EVAW Unit- UN Women) and Ms. Urvashi Gandhi (Director- Global Advocacy, Breakthrough India), were the esteemed speakers under the patronage of Prof. Najma Akhtar (Vice-Chancellor, Jamia Millia Islamia).
- The Department in collaboration with Centre for Early Childhood and Research, Jamia Millia Islamia organized a national webinar on **“Impact of Covid-19 Pandemic on Marginalised Children and the Way Forward”** on 28th August 2020 under the patronage of Prof. Najma Akhtar (Vice-Chancellor, Jamia Millia Islamia). Dr. Rita Panicker (Founder & Director- Butterflies, India), Mr. Aftab Mohammad (Child Protection Specialist- UNICEF), Dr. Kiran Modi (Founder & Managing Trustee- Udayan Care), and Mr. Prabhat Kumar (National Thematic Manager- Child Protection- Save the Children), were the four speakers who enlightened the attendees with their insights.



- On the eve of International Human Resource Professional Day, the Department organized a webinar on “**Industry Interface Post-Covid Disruptions and Talent Management- A Human Resource Perspective**” on 26th September 2020. The webinar was graced by the presence of the following speakers -- Mr. Saif ul Islam (AVP & Global Head- Compensation & Benefits, Tata Communications), Ms. Kiran Singh (General Manager- Corporate HR, Mother Dairy), Ms. Mehernaaz Zahir (Management Consultant, Speaker, Life Coach), and Mr. Kusumadhar Pandey (Head- Human Resources- MphRx).
- The Department organized a consultative webinar on “**Draft of National Council of Social Work (Education and Practice) Bill, 2020**” on 9th November 2020. The webinar focussed on the draft of the NCSW Bill circulated by the Union Government, which aims to regulate quality, flexibility, and autonomy in social work education and practice. Prof. Archana Dassi (Head, Department of Social Work, Jamia Millia Islamia), Prof. Zubair Meenai (President- IASWE), Prof. Murli Desai (Convener, Drafting Committee, NCSW Bill 2020), Dr. Shewli Kumar (Associate Professor- TISS), Dr. Nisha Agrawal (Deputy Director), and Dr. Jahanara M Gajendragad (Professor & Head, Department of Psychiatric Social Work, IHBAS), were the esteemed speakers.
- **Student Support:** The students were given extensive social, emotional support by the Department so that they function efficiently in the given situation. The individual problems of each student was taken into consideration and they were reached out to by the faculty to initiate a conversation. Students' safety and well being were emphasized and given a preference at all times.
- **Professional Skill Augmentation Workshops:** Several online workshops were held by the University for job readiness of students for upcoming opportunities. PLACEMENT GUIDELINES :

1. The organisations that are interested in recruiting students from the department will have to convey their prerequisite in the prescribed placement form, as per the schedule communicated.
2. The slots for the prospective Recruiting organisation will be allotted based on the following points:
 - 2.1. Job profile offered
 - 2.2. Remuneration and Incentives
 - 2.3. Geographical location and mobility
 - 2.4. Number of positions offered
3. The name(s) of the selected candidate(s) will have to be communicated by the Recruiting organisation to the Department and the candidate(s) within two days of the placement process.
4. It will be appreciated if the Recruiting organisation can also provide the selected candidate(s) with the provisional offer letter.
5. Apart from the selected candidates, all the Recruiting organisations are requested to prepare a waiting list of candidates in order to avoid uncertainties.
6. The placement brochure should not be the criteria for any recruiting organisation to select or reject any interested candidate. It should be done strictly on the basis of the CVs that are submitted and the subsequent recruitment process.
7. If the recruiting organisation wants to conduct any off campus interviews, they are required to notify the placement committee in advance.
8. If the recruiting organisation is unable to visit the campus due to any reasons, the placements can be facilitated by the Placement committee through Web/Telephonic/Skype means. Personal interviews can also be arranged at the Recruitment organisation's office at a mutually convenient date.
9. Discrimination on the basis of caste, class, sex, gender, disability or religion leading to conflict among the candidate(s) will not be tolerated and will result in intervention by the Placement Committee.
