

A lecture and demonstration on “Multimedia In Education” was organized at FTK-Centre for Information Technology in the forenoon of 15th January 2008. The lecture was delivered by Mr. Azyz Sharafy, Associate Professor, Washburn University, USA. Prof. Obiad Siddiqui from AJK-MCRC was the Chief Guest. Prof. Z. H. Khan, Hony. Director, FTK-CIT welcomed the participants and introduced the audience about the recent IT facilities created at the center.

Mr. Sharafy delivered a wonderful lecture on the recent advancements in the field of Multimedia and showed some fascinating animation work using Adobe Flash. He emphasized the need of computer knowledge and its applications in various disciplines. Mr. Sharafy narrated his own experience of shifting from the



conventional art to computer art, graphics and animation. Emphasizing the significance of multimedia, which has brought a revolution in education, he urged the faculty members to enrich themselves with this latest technology in order to keep pace with developed world. Mr. Sharafy advised the students to learn multimedia techniques, which offers better job opportunities in the fast expanding animation industry.

*Extension Lecture
on
“Digitization of Libraries”
by*

James Harry Nye, University of Chicago, USA
(4th February 2008)

An extension lecture on “Digitization of Libraries” was organized by FTK-Centre for Information Technology on 4th Feb 2008. The lecture was delivered by Dr. Jim Harry Nye, Director, South Asia Language and Area Center, University of Chicago. The lecture was well attended by the staff of Dr. Zakir Husain Library, Seminar Libraries of Jamia, students of the Library & Information Science, and members of FTK-CIT. Dr. Gayas Makhdumi, Librarian, Dr. Zakir Husain Library presided over the program.

During his lecture, Dr. Nye deliberated on fundamental issues related to digitization of libraries. Narrating his extensive experience with digitization work around the world, he lamented that most libraries fail to put up their mission statement before starting the digitization work. He emphasized that policies on very basic issues such as - what is to be collected and what is “not” to be collected, accountability, institutional linkages etc. must be in place. He further observed that libraries and people involved in digitization somehow start putting more focus on technological issues rather than on the content quality. This invariable leads to problems for the end users.

To further elaborate the importance of quality contents, Dr. Nye, cited examples of incorrect information in the famous - “Million Books Project” led by Carnegie Mellon University.

In this lecture, Dr. Nye emphasized that:

- All libraries must follow the principle of “Do no harm” while carrying out digitization work.
- Books and all other academic assets in the library must be treated with respect.

- During the digitization process, all precautions must be taken for protecting all sources of knowledge such as books, microfilms, manuscripts etc. Dr. Nye further suggested the need for collaboration among libraries for facilitating open access to digital contents. He also emphasized the need for closer involvement of students from varying backgrounds in library digitization process. He argued that the students can act as a workforce to ascertain quality during digitization.

Further, Dr. Nye recommended that enticing topics, such as data mining on digital repositories in libraries may also attract students from technical backgrounds to undertake some responsibility in the library digitization process.








The following chart gives a statistics about the number of pages (uploaded/updated) on the Jamia website in the 1st quarter of 2008:




A pictorial presentation of various updated features on the Jamia website during Q1/2008.

Events and Conferences


Based on requests received from various departments centres in the first quarter of 2008, fifty-six links were added to the Jamia website under the "Events and Conferences" feature.




During the 1st quarter of 2008, 57 Press Releases, received from the Office of the Media Coordinator, were uploaded on the Jamia website




Profiles/CVs related to Departments/ Centres and Faculty Members


Some 126 documents related to updated CV's of faculty members and profiles of some departments and centres were uploaded on the Jamia Website.


In this Quarter

The first graph shows most popular website categories that have been surfed by the users.



The most popular websites that have been browsed during Jan.-March 2008.



Top ten preferred data download sites during the first quarter of 2008.





Internet Bandwidth Utilization

Upto February 2008, Jamia had 4 Mbps bandwidth - 2 Mbps through radiolink from CDAC, Noida and the other 2 Mbps bandwidth through leased line from ERNET, India. In March 2008, 2 Mbps additional bandwidth from CDAC, Noida was added. The utilization of the bandwidth may be seen from the following graphs:

Network Expansion and Maintenance

During the period January-March 2008, following extension and maintenance works related to campus network were carried out :

- ◆ Construction of RF Tower at Noam Chomsky Complex for Wireless connectivity.
- ◆ Installation of Access Points at the following locations for providing WiFi Connectivity
 1. Department of Biosciences,
 2. Sociology and Psychology departments,
 3. History and Geography departments,
 4. Faculty of Humanities,
 5. New CIT Building,
 6. BAK Girls Hostel
- ◆ Leased Line shifted from the old CIT building to the new CIT building.

- ◆ Fibre cable was laid down from the FTK-CIT building to the History & Geography Building. Cabling work was also carried out inside the building.
- ◆ Splicing of fibre between
 - (i) New SRK Hostel and BRA Hostel
 - (ii) Administration and Noam Chomsky Complex
- ◆ Fibre Termination in Building and Construction department was carried out due to damage caused to optical fibre.
- ◆ Replacement of faulty switches and modules and new installations:
 - i MTRJ module in core switch at old CIT building.
 - ii Layer 3 switch installed at the Faculty of Humanities & Languages.
 - iii Fibre module in 2924 MXL switch installed at the Administration Block.
 - iv Fibre Module in 2924 MXL switch installed at the Procter's Office.
