JMI's Outreach Programme organizes a Public Art Exhibition on "gender-based violence"

The Outreach Programme, Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) in collaboration with Centre for Advocacy and Research (CFAR) is organizing a two-day Public Art Exhibition on December 6 & 7, 2016 in the lawns of Dr. M.A Ansari Auditorium, JMI. The purpose of the exhibition is to generate awareness against gender-based violence both within the confines of home and outside.
