Jamia Millia Islamia, an institution originally established at Aligarh in United Provinces, India in 1920 became a Central University by an Act of the Indian Parliament in 1988. In Urdu language, Jamia means 'University', and Millia means 'National'.

The story of its growth from a small institution in the pre-independence India to a central university located in New Delhi - offering integrated education from nursery to research in specialized areas - is a saga of dedication, conviction and vision of a people who worked against all odds and saw it growing step by step. The university has been accredited with Grade 'A' by NAAC in 2015 and was placed at 19th position in the "Overall Ranking" for 2018 carried out by MHRD's National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF).

### ABOUT DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATIONAL STUDIES


