Faculty of Dentistry, Jamia Millia Islamia Opens Second Satellite Dental Clinic at Madanpur Khadar Village

The Faculty of Dentistry, Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI), has inaugurated its second Satellite Dental Clinic today at Madanpur Khadar village, further strengthening its commitment to community health and outreach. The new clinic aims to enhance oral health awareness and provide accessible, affordable dental care to marginalized and underserved sections of society. Located at the CASP Delhi Unit, Madanpur Khadar, the facility will offer diagnostic and referral services to local residents, helping bridge the gap in oral health care access. On the inaugural day, 100 people underwent a dental check-up and referral in the clinic. Faculty members- Dr. Abhishek Mehta and Dr. Aditi Verma and five interns from Public Health Dentistry visited the clinic today

Since 2013, the Faculty has successfully operated a Satellite Dental Clinic at Nizamuddin Basti, which has served as a model for community-based dental services. Building on this experience, the new clinic at Madanpur Khadar marks another step towards expanding the Faculty's outreach and impact in promoting oral health. The initiative is part of the Faculty's comprehensive Community Outreach Program, which also includes a Mobile Dental Van and regular dental camps organized across Delhi and surrounding regions. Through these efforts, the Faculty seeks to deliver preventive, promotive, and curative oral health care to those who need it most.

Speaking about the expansion, Prof. Keya Sircar, Dean, Faculty of Dentistry, emphasised that such initiatives align with Jamia Millia Islamia's broader mission of serving society through education, research, and direct community engagement. The new satellite clinic is expected to significantly contribute to improving oral health outcomes and awareness among the residents of Madanpur Khadar and neighbouring areas.
