



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THE BEGINNING OF ACADEMIC JOURNEY: ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

Ph.D., M.A. EPA, M.Ed., and PGDEM (Batch 2024-25)

The orientation for newly admitted Ph.D. scholars (Batch 2024-25) marked the formal initiation on 10 March, 2025, into the department's vibrant research culture. Scholars were acquainted with research protocols, ethical frameworks, and supervisory structures that define the department's scholarly landscape. Senior faculty and supervisors shared their vision, inspiring scholars to pursue rigorous, meaningful, and socially responsive research.

The MAEPA orientation, tailored for students embarking on a nuanced exploration of educational policy and institutional leadership, was conducted on 1st October, 2024, and offered a deep dive into the programme's academic scaffolding. Through immersive dialogues, students were introduced to the interlinkages between theory and practice that anchor the curriculum. Sessions encouraged critical thinking and policy literacy, while interactive discussions nurtured peer connectivity and intellectual curiosity.

The M.Ed. orientation, held on 5th August, 2024, was shaped to align students with the department's pedagogical philosophy and reflective practices. The programme introduced foundational components of the curriculum, methodologies of teaching and assessment, and the vision of professional teacher preparation. The sessions also spotlighted experiential learning opportunities and underscored the importance of reflective pedagogy in shaping future educators.

For the Post Graduate Diploma in Educational Management (PGDEM) cohort, the orientation was held on 5th August, 2024, which offered a roadmap to practical engagement in leadership, planning, and school management. Students were briefed on the modular structure of the course, its skill-based outcomes, and the career pathways it opens. The platform also allowed interaction with mentors and resource persons who would guide them through a practice-oriented curriculum.

Research Proposal Presentation by M.Ed., M.A. EPA, M.A. ECD 3rd Semester, and PGDEM First-Year Students

As part of the master's degree curriculum, the department organized a five-day research proposal presentation for students enrolled in programs such as M.Ed., M.A. in Educational Planning and Administration (EPA), M.A. in Early Childhood Development (ECD), and the Postgraduate Diploma in Educational Management (PGDEM). This academic exercise represented a significant phase in the students' scholarly development, offering a formal platform to present their research ideas and receive insightful feedback from faculty and peers. The event fostered a collaborative atmosphere, encouraging students to refine their research questions, methodologies, and theoretical frameworks. It not only acknowledged the students' academic rigor and commitment but also underscored the department's dedication to cultivating a robust research culture.

A seminar for the finalization of research titles was organized for first-year Ph.D. scholars prior to their formal registration. During this academic exercise, scholars presented their preliminary research ideas—including proposed titles, objectives, and research questions—before a panel comprising their supervisors, RAC members, and the Departmental Research Committee. The session provided a rigorous evaluative platform where experts offered critical feedback, raised methodological and conceptual concerns, and guided the refinement of each proposal. Following detailed discussions and scholarly scrutiny, the research topics were finalized, marking an essential step in the doctoral journey and reinforcing the department's commitment to academic rigor and research excellence.

THEORY-PRACTICE CONNECT



Educational Visit to National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), 2024




104th FOUNDATION DAY
