- 2. Reading and analysis of the works of renowned Indian photographers & contemporary Indian photographic practices

Topics:

- Unit 1: Major land marks in History of photography (Colonial Indian photography and studio spaces)
- Unit 2: From Painting to Photography
- Unit 3: Photography and the work of Major theorists; Debates around photography (Indexicality, performative, authenticity etc.); Post Modern Theory
- Unit 4: The effect of technological changes on photography; Photography in the Age of Digital: multimedia, web and installation art
- Unit 5: Master Indian photographers (Raghu Rai, Raghubir Singh, Dayanita Singh, Prabuddha Das Gupta, Homai Vyarawalla, Pablo Bartholomew etc.)

DSP 102: ESSENTIALS OF PHOTOGRAPHY

Course Description: The course is designed to acquaint learners with the basics of photographic practices and image-making techniques. It seeks to strengthen their technical ability towards the journey of image creation. Through the coursework, a full range of aesthetic and creative skills concerning image making are taught and nurtured. The course emphasises the application of theory, serving as the foundation for hands-on training. It seeks to foster an ideal balance of technical as well as theoretical knowledge in photography.

Course Objectives:

- 1. To familiarise learners with the basics of photography and its techniques.
- 2. Up-skilling them to handle the camera and adjust settings for producing the quality image.
- 3. Preparing students to use photography as a tool of creative expression.

Topics:

Unit 1: Understanding camera (Basic camera controls, menu and working); Types of Cameras (On the basis of format, structure)

- Unit 2: Exposures (Aperture F stop, T spot, Shutter speed and types of shutter, ISO), White Balance
- Unit 3: Types of Lenses (Classification of lens on the basis of focal length, perspective and angle of view)
- Unit 4: Depth of Field (Circles of confusion, Use of Aperture, distance, type of lenses on DOP)

Unit 5: Filters; Light meters and Metering modes.

DSP 103: STUDIO AND COMMERCIAL PHOTOGRAPHY

Course Description: The course is designed to familiarise learners with advertising and commercial photography scenario. In process, they will develop portfolio that showcases their commercial photography to cater to the industry clients, art directors and modelling portfolio managements.

Course Objectives:

- 1. To familiarise learners with studio lightings and equipments, composition and camera settings.
- 2. Enable them to create compelling portraitures.
- 3. Training to work with models & products, building professional portfolios, budgeting, contracts etc.

Topics:

Unit 1: Understanding Nature of Light and its implications - Natural Light (v/s) Artificial light; Direct Light, Soft light, Hard light, Directional Light.

- Unit 2: Understanding Brightness, Contrast, Mid-tones, Highlights, Shadow and Silhouettes
- Unit 3: Lighting equipment (Soft boxes, umbrellas, Fresnel, Skimmers, reflectors, etc)
- Unit 4: Flashes & Gels Use of portable Flash Units and colour filters, gels; Basic of flash light, Strobe etc with concept such as Guide no and inverse square law
- Unit 5: Lighting setups Portrait/Fashion/Food/Product Photography (Split, Rembrandt, Butterfly, Loop, Broad light, Short light, Three-point light, Five point light); Studio & On-location lighting exercise
